

## Early warning systems

Early Warning Systems -MEOWS



MEOWS charts are fundamental as an early warning tool.

Failure to identify early signs of serious illness in obstetric patients has been a recurrent feature in cases of maternal death and serious morbidity

They should include

- Respiratory Rate
- O2 Saturation
- Heart Rate
- Systolic Blood pressure
- Diastolic Blood pressure
- Temperature

Additional considerations to this

Urine output

Altered level of consciousness is an urgent marker

## **Prioritising Care**

- Assess the MEOWS score
- Escalate based on the triggers

 Once you have concerns that the patient is deteriorating you should do a systematic assessment using the ABCDEF approach

### A= AIRWAY

## **D=Disability**


How do you assess disability?

- Level of consciousness
- Pupils
- Blood Glucose

## E = Exposure

What are you looking for ?

**Blood loss** 

Rashes

Abdominal Distension (not related to pregnant uterus)

Possible DVT

Wound

Sites of potential infection (puncture sites, throat lochia)

## F = Fetus

The fetus makes the uterus a significant organ after 20 weeks and has the capacity to impact on maternal health and wellbeing

# DO YOU NEED TO REASSESS AND START AGAIN

#### **ABCDEF**

 THE AIRWAY MUST ALWAYS BE THE PRIORITY WHEN DOING THE SYSTEMATIC ASSESSMENT

# Without a protected airway the patient will die!!!!

#### DOCUMENTATION

- Don't forget to use ABCDEF assessment in your records
- SBAR when handing over or requesting help
- Situation
- Background
- Assessment
- Recommendation

### Documentation

- A Airway Patent Sally talking in full sentences
- B Breathing Resp rate 14, Chest movement equal and clear on auscultation
- C Circulation Pulse 90, BP 110/65 CRT 2secs
- D Disability AVPU Alert and orientated BM 5
  Pupils equal and react to light
- E Exposure No evidence of rashes, pv loss normal
- F Fetus No t applicable as post natal
